"for every £1 of venture capital investment in the UK,

all-female founder teams get less than a penny,

all-male teams get 89p, and mixed-gender teams receive 10p.

The situation is mirrored across Europe, where 93 cents in every euro of venture capital goes to companies without a single woman on their founding team.

This is a loss for the investors and for the world."

Female entrepreneurs report that investors routinely assume


they lack technical knowledge about their products,

their pitches are subject to greater interrogation,


and they have to fight harder to prove their worth."


Main driving factors for entrepreneurship



The percentage of individuals, by gender, who answered "yes" to the question "Do you have access to training on how to start or grow a business?" in 2013





Entrepreneurship courses in Adriatic Ionian area: undergraduate curricula in Universities






